CCHR is pleased to host an online event entitled "I choose to challenge gender inequality" to celebrate International Women's Day. This event is to be held online on **Thursday 4 March 2021 from 15:00 to 18:00.**

The purpose of this celebration is:

- To raise awareness amongst the public on women's participation in civil society and on the work undertaken by women human rights defenders.
- To highlight the challenging environment in which women who engage in civil society or public participation operate in Cambodia.

This event will start with a welcome remark by CCHR's Executive Director Mrs. Chak Sopheap and then proceed with a panel discussion amongst women with backgrounds in journalism and human rights activism. Afterwards, CCHR's Voices for Gender Equality Project will hold a forum theatre performance – an interactive theatre style presentation in which a problem scenario is presented, and the audience is encouraged to interact and test out attempts to develop best solutions to positively impact the outcome of the problem. To end the afternoon, there will be traditional music (CHA PEY DONG VENG) for entertainment.
